# WA AND SA PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRIES INTO REGULATION OF FRANCHISING

The national uniform regulation of franchising in Australia, through the Franchising Code of Conduct made with the authority of the Competition and Consumer Act, is under threat in Western Australia and South Australia. In both States, parliamentary inquiries are presently examining state regulation of franchising. Also the South Australian Government has announced it is preparing a draft Bill which will be "the most comprehensive set of franchising laws in the country." It would be a disastrous step to adopt state-based franchising legislation. If these proceed it is not unrealistic to envisage that franchising will one day suffer the same costly inefficiencies as the retail leasing industry because of separate, and different, legislation around Australia. # EXPOSURE DRAFT OF NSW RETAIL LEASES AMENDMENT BILL 2011 RELEASED

The NSW Government has released for public comment an exposure draft of a Bill to amend the Retail Leases Act, with comments due by 11 February. This is despite major amendments to the Act in 2006 (amounting to 67 pages) following a thorough and consultative review of the Act in 2004-05. This Bill appears to be the product of the idiosyncratic and one-sided Discussion Paper released in April 2008 (Shop Talk 18/4/08 & 30/5/08). We say "appears" since many of the amendments in the Bill did not appear in this Discussion Paper and have not been discussed with any of the parties in the retail leasing industry. It is puzzling why the draft Bill has been released now since Parliament has already been prorogued for the election on 26 March and nobody in the present Government believes they will be in a position to present the Bill to Parliament after the election.

# TASMANIAN FAIR TRADING CODE FOR RETAIL TENANCIES HAS BEEN RENEWED

The Tasmanian Fair Trading (Code of Practice for Retail Tenancies) Regulations, which was renewed for two years in 2008 (Shop Talk 12/12/08 & 21/11/08), lapsed again on 4 December 2010 but has been reinstated by the new Australian Consumer Law (Tasmania) Act.
